FALKLANDS: STATEMENTS TO THE PRESS

- 1. REUTERS ARE REPORTING THAT THE SECRETARY-GENERAL HOPES TO HAVE FINAL ANSWERS FROM BRITAIN AND ARGENTINA TO HIS FALKLANDS PEACE PROPOSALS WITHIN 36 HOURS. THIS IS NOT A STRICTLY ACCURATE REPORT.
- 2. AS HE ENTERED THE UN BUILDING THIS MORNING, PEREZ DE CUELLAR SAID IN REPLY TO QUESTIONS THAT:
 - (A) THE NEXT DAYS WILL BE VERY DECISIVE:
 - (B) HE HAD NEVER HAD IN MIND ENDLESS NEGOTIATIONS WITH THE PARTIES, BUT HOPED TO REACH A DEFINITIVE POINT TODAY OR TOMORROW:
 - (C) THE POSITIONS OF THE PARTIES WERE CLOSER THAN WHEN HE STARTED:
 - (D) (WERE THEY CLOSE ENOUGH FOR HIM TO BE ABLE TO PRESENT HIS PLAN?) THERE WERE STILL DIFFICULTIES, BUT HE HOPED TO IRON THEM OUT:
 - (E) THERE WAS ALWAYS THE RISK OF A BREAKDOWN, BUT ALSO THE POSSIBILITY OF A BREAKTHROUGH.
