
Reception to mark the Bicentenary of

Tomorrow evening, you have agreed to attend the Home Secretary's reception for the Peel Bicentenary. This takes place at Lancaster House. I attach the invitation (at Flag A) and a guest list (at Flag B).

You will arrive shortly after 6.30pm and you will be met by the Home Secretary. There will be a photocall in the foyer, including a photograph of you with the MP's for Bury (Peel's birthplace), Alistair Burt and David Sumberg, and possibly other local dignitaries. There will also be a policeman (PC White from Bow Street) who will be dressed as a "Peeler" with whom you may wish to be photographed.

You will then proceed upstairs, where the Home Secretary will show you a small exhibition of Peel memorabilia (mostly documents, I believe).

The Home Secretary will say a few words, to which you will not be expected to reply. You will then be free to circulate until you depart (at 7.30pm) for dinner in the House of Lords.

The Home Secretary has invited you to be guest of honour at a reception in February next year to mark the 200th anniversary of Sir Robert Peel. David Sumberg and Alistair Burt had also written to you asking if you might attend a service of commemoration over the weekend of 6/7 February in Bury.

Alistair Burt has now returned to say that there is no magical significance with regard to that service, and that Robert Peel celebrations are in fact likely to continue in Bury throughout the year. He has therefore suggested that if you visit the constituency at any time he would be able to arrange an appropriate event. For his part the Home Secretary has suggested that he invite Messrs. Sumberg and Burt, and some notable dignitaries from Bury, to his reception where you would be able to have a brief photocall with them. This would give the necessary publicity in the constituency, and would I know be very much appreciated.

In these circumstances it looks as if the best use of your time would be to attend the Home Secretary's reception, omit the visit to Bury over the weekend of 6/7 February, and try and include a visit to the area as part of the normal programme of regional tours.
